

Each hostel is also equipped with an administration office, dining hall, separate sick-bays for boys and girls, two warden rooms, showers and toilets, washing areas, kitchens, a kitchen storage and a surau.

"Sometimes, we have to brave the choppy waters and there are times our parents do not have enough money to pay for our boat fare. I am glad that PETRONAS has helped Sekolah Kebangsaan (SK) Balambangan Banggi to build a hostel for pupils and I am glad my parents have allowed me to stay at school. My studies have improved as we get to attend extra classes during our stay.



Sleepless nights and hard work finally paid off for students of Sekolah Menengah Kebangsaan (SMK) Riam in Miri, Sarawak after their device won first prize at the AAY Chairman's Circle Awards 2019.

Riam Xplug is a device that alerts users to unplug their gadgets and automatically shuts off electricity after three minutes.

Teaching is the career that launches a thousand other careers

As new jobs come on stream, we want to strengthen the skills of teachers so they can prepare students for change to be effective contributors to the economy.

By upskilling our "edu-creators", we aim to produce a qualified stream of talent that are able to tackle challenges and complexities for a better world.

This is aligned with the Malaysian Education Blueprint of 2013 to improve the quality and capabilities of teachers, who have great influence in the choices and education outcomes of students, particularly in shaping their Higher Order Thinking Skills (HOTS).

Program Duta Guru Kementerian Pendidikan Malaysia - Yayasan PETRONAS

This flagship collaboration with the Ministry of Education (MOE) aims to develop 4,500 highly competent and committed STEM teachers who will serve as role models to enhance Higher Order Thinking Skills (HOTS) through STEM education as a foundation to be a competitive nation by 2030.

This nine-year commitment by Yayasan PETRONAS in partnership with MOE is one we take on with perseverance and pride. The programme involves secondary school teachers from schools where majority of the students are from families in the B40 category. As the teachers receive training, they will work towards improving STEM interest and competency among students; ensuring the country continues to remain competitive with the skills required for a productive workforce in the future. Building Interest Within Communities



The wonders of science neither starts nor ends with teachers and students, but it begins at home with family, and within the community.

We love fostering conversations about how and why things work, and what new possibilities can emerge from the application of Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM).

Petrosains PlaySmart

Communities outside of the Klang Valley now have easy access to quality science related activities and educational programmes, similiar to those available at the main science centre in KLCC.

Petrosains PlaySmart first opened in Penang and Langkawi in 2003. Today, there are four Petrosains PlaySmart centres - Johor Bahru, Kuantan, Kota Kinabalu and Kuching, that run 26 programmes for audiences of all ages. In 2019, these four centres recorded a total of 535,067 visitors.

PETRONAS Counsellors Programme (PCP)

Guidance counsellors work in schools to assist students as they make academic and career choices.

PETRONAS therefore crafted this programme with the Ministry of Education's Counselling Unit to strengthen a counsellor's role in advising students on career pathways, with a focus on STEM and Technical and Vocational Education (TVET).

PCP provides a platform for school counsellors to gain more insight on career prospects especially in STEM.

Community Well-being

We improve the quality of life of the underserved - from youth, single mothers and malnourished children to families who may not have basic necessities such as clean water on a regular basis.



Wealth for the Poor

In support of the government's Shared Prosperity Vision and efforts to alleviate poverty in the country, Yayasan PETRONAS - along with our partners, rolled out various programmes to create and strengthen income streams for B40 communities.

Planting Tomorrow

Planting Tomorrow aims to alleviate poverty by first providing basic amenities - including a water gravity-feed supply, to areas requiring a clean and steady stream of water. Once established, agriculture equipment and seeds were supplied in order to help communities cultivate a sustainable income through farming ventures. This was done in Pitas and Kota Marudu, Sabah.

In Kuala Nerus, Terengganu, participants received training on financial management, product marketing, motivation and personal grooming. Additionally, they received monthly food aid worth RM80 for a year via a cashless payment system - through our partnership with MyKasih Foundation.

NOTE: This programme will transition to MEKAR from 2020 onwards.

MEKAR

In Kedah, Program MEKAR is implemented as empowerNCER in collaboration with the Northern Corridor Implementation Authority (NCIA).



Program Memampankan Ekonomi Asas Rakyat (MEKAR) was launched in 2019 with an aim to reach 13,600 beneficiaries (or 3,400 families) in eight states over two years, enabling inclusive social progress. The programme is designed to improve the standards of living and to strengthen the income stream of B40 communities - the urban and rural poor, sustainably.

Program MEKAR's two-year target









"empowerNCER is designed to provide participants with skills to help them garner an income for their families. The focus will be on micro, small and medium-sized enterprises which will act as economic generators for their community, as well as the communities surrounding them.

This will help to ensure there is sufficient economic stimulus and transform lives particularly in the rural areas."

Cancer Research Malaysia (CRM)

In the next few years, the World Health Organisation (WHO) estimates that 45 million Asians are expected to be diagnosed with cancer.

One of the organisations dedicated towards reversing cancer is Cancer Research Malaysia (CRM).

In support of its mission, PETRONAS, since 2001, has contirbuted RM13.5 million towards CRM's operations. This allowed its researchers to work in six internationally significant programmes, including in the areas of discovery, tool development and intervention of the disease.

Yayasan PETRONAS extended this commitment in 2019 by contributing another RM8 million for the period through to 2023. "Because of advances made through cancer research, survival has improved from one in four some 40 years ago, to two in four surviving cancer today. Sadly, even though Asians make up half of the world's cancer cases, we make up less than 10 per cent of the research globally. There may be factors in our genetics - our lifestyle and our diets, that lead some to develop certain cancers, and also make us react differently to treatments. Research done at CRM helps identify the treatment and screening strategies that are best for cancer patients in Asia. This is possible because PETRONAS and Yayasan PETRONAS have been supporting us as our founding donor since 2001, enabling us to build a research laboratory with cutting edge technologies for medical research. This has been critical to ensure that Asians are not left out in the research to find a cure for cancer."



Conservation for Good

From marine to mangrove, shores to rivers and rainforests, Yayasan PETRONAS aims to reduce year-on-year environmental impact; through conservation and carbon neutral programmes.



Trees4Life

More than 150 staff volunteers from PETRONAS, Sabah Forestry Department, the local community, as well as other government departments and agencies came together to plant 1,000 trees at the Crocker Range Forest Reserve. The Reserve covers an area of 350,584 hectares. It consists of mountain chains, hills and valleys, and is home to a wide variety of vegetation; from tropical lowland and hill dipterocarp to upper montane forests.

PETRONAS staff volunteers also conducted workshops at the St Michael's Secondary School in Penampang to raise awareness on environmental conservation for 100 students.

Be Green

PETRONAS Chemicals Group Berhad (PCG), in collaboration with Yayasan PETRONAS, launched its Be Green programme with the #RecycleForLifeCycle awareness campaign this year. The annual programme, which started in 2013, is anchored on two objectives:

1 Education

Educate the community on proper waste collection and segregation, through 3R principles, focusing on anti-littering, as well as benefits and impact of plastic usage on the environment.

2 Awareness

Raise awareness on

At the launch, more than 500 volunteers comprising community members, Institut Kemahiran Tinggi Belia Negara (IKTBN) students and PETRONAS employees participated in the clean-up of Sungai Langat, waste segregation and tree-planting activities. Walk4Trees

PETRONAS got its 48,000 employees and their family members to step in for an environmental challenge, while staying fit.

Aimed at recording 20 million steps by 2021, PETRONAS has committed to plant one tree for every one million steps, which means 20,000 trees could be planted.

Through this, PETRONAS aims to constitute a carbon sink, a natural reservoir to negate the effects of carbon emissions. Eleven locations across Malaysia have been identified as planting sites. Participants use a bespoke PETRONAS MestiFit4Health mobile app to track their steps.

Abundance for Our Future

Ten years ago, PETRONAS embarked on protecting and preserving the Imbak Canyon Conservation Area (ICCA). The 27,599-hectare primary rainforest is home to a wide variety of flora, fauna and unique landscapes. It is gazetted as a Class 1 Forest Reserve.

Taking this a step further, in 2019, we launched the Imbak Canyon Studies Centre (ICSC) and announced an environment research grant. We hope this effort will spur research related to biodiversity, carbon sinks and new energy, while ensuring that the conservation is done in a sustainable and scalable way through ethno-forestry.

A ten-day research expedition at ICCA which includes ICSC and Gunung Kuli Research Station was organised in December 2019 for 50 researchers and Yayasan Sabah personnel. Since 2010, PETRONAS has committed

RM83 million

towards the Imbak Canyon Conservation Area.

This is the first and largest ever local partnership with Yayasan Sabah Group to conserve a gazetted forest protection area in the state.



The launch of ICSC was an important step in Sabah's move to protect its rainforest heritage and the environment. Adding to this is the ICSC's capabilities to host world-class biodiversity and environmental research.



"Imbak Canyon Studies Centre will strengthen the position of Imbak Canyon Conservation Area as a centre of learning for the indigenous communities, in biodiversity conservation and sustainable use of natural resources, as well as gene bank conservation and exploration of pharmaceutical and biotechnological potentials.

In line with the mission to improve the quality of life of Malaysians in Sabah, the construction of ICSC will create more jobs for communities, especially for young people, living nearby the Imbak area - through hospitality and tourism related activities. Through this we hope they can improve their livelihood in a sustainable way."

Fun Facts



As a tree matures, it can consume 48 pounds of carbon dioxide per year and release enough oxygen for you to breathe for two years!



In an urban setting, the shade from trees - in combination with the water vapour they release, can reduce peak temperatures by as much as 11°C to 25°C compared to unshaded areas.



Some estimates say the shade from a single tree can save the same amount of energy it takes to power 10 room-sized air conditioners for 20 hours a day!



Trees can also prevent flooding. A typical mediumsized tree can intercept as much as 2,380 gallons of rainfall per year.
