

With the pandemic in retreat in 2022, it was an opportune time to reignite our plans to reach out and serve our communities through our Education, Community Well-being & Development and Environment pillars. Beyond this, we also provided relief and recovery services to communities immediately affected by COVID-19 and severe flood disasters as well as in the aftermath, while intensifying our activities that aid B40 households.

Through our Education pillar, the **Bridging the Online Learning Divide (BOLD)** programme
continued to distribute learning devices to enrolled
children who experienced challenges in learning
losses and uneven access to online learning due to
COVID-19. Our flagship Program Duta Guru (PDG)
reached new heights as 253 teachers graduated
from the programme this year following a two-year
immersive training in Engineering Design Process.

We have also advanced in our initiatives under the Community Well-being and Development pillar. For the year in review, our **Memampankan Ekonomi Asas Rakyat** (MEKAR) participants achieved livelihood breakthroughs through our upskilling programme with our strategic partners **Northern Corridor Implementation Authority** (NCIA) and East Coast Economic Region Development Council (ECERDC).

The Sentuhan Kasih initiative also uplifted lives through the Sentuhan Kasih Festive, Homes and Disaster Relief programmes where we channelled a total of

Under the Environment pillar, our Walk4Trees planting programme that was carried out in collaboration with PETRONAS' Group Health, Safety and Environmental (GHSE) and in partnership with the Global Environment Centre (GEC) continued to flourish. Through the support of our partner and participating communities, we successfully reached our tree-planting goal by December 2022. We also enriched the communities in the vicinity by creating awareness on nature conservation and

upskilling them by providing the opportunity in setting up nurseries. We have also learned a lot from the communities on the values of resilience, dedication, and hard work.

To further illustrate our work, we also compiled heart-warming Impact Stories of beneficiaries, detailing their transformative journeys and positive life changes.

In 2022, our programmes, grants and donations collectively made significant impacts on the lives of over 115,600 beneficiaries, funded by a budget of RM42.57 million.

Tan Sri Mohd Bakke Salleh is the Chairman of Petroliam Nasional Berhad (PETRONAS). Prior to his current appointment in August 2021, he served as Chairman of Telekom Malaysia Berhad.

Over the course of his thirty-eight-year career to date, Tan Sri Mohd Bakke has held various key positions in both government-linked organisations and the private sector. He has served as Chairman of the Federal Land Development Authority (FELDA), Chairman of the Malaysian Palm Oil Board (MPOB) and Chairman of Bank Islam Malaysia Bhd.

He was also President & Group Chief Executive of Sime Darby Bhd, and subsequently, Executive Deputy Chairman & Managing Director of Sime Darby Plantation Bhd. Earlier, he served as Group Managing Director at Felda Holdings Bhd, before becoming Group President & CEO of Felda Global Ventures Holdings Bhd. (FGV).

He has helmed Lembaga Tabung Haji and also served a Managing Director at various companies including Syarikat Perumahan Pegawai Kerajaan (SPPK) Sdn. Bhd., Federal Power Sdn. Bhd. and Electra House Sdn. Bhd. He has recorded stints at Pengurusan Danaharta Nasional Bhd., Island & Peninsular Bhd.; Citibank Bhd.; Caltex Oil Malaysia Ltd. and Ernst & Young, Kuala Lumpur.

He has served as Non-Executive Director on the Boards of several Malaysian public- listed companies including Eastern & Oriental Bhd. and Southern Acids Malaysia Bhd.; as Council Member of philanthropic foundation Yayasan Sime Darby and as Pro- Chancellor of Universiti Putra Malaysia (UPM). He is currently a Honorary Council Member of the Malaysian Palm Oil Association (MPOA).

Tan Sri Mohd Bakke holds a Bachelor of Science (Economics) from the London School of Economics (LSE). He is a Fellow of the Institute of Chartered Accountants in England & Wales (ICAEW) and a member of the Malaysian Institute of Accountants.

A lawyer by qualification, Tan Sri Dr Rafiah was the first Malaysian to be appointed Assistant Secretary-General for Human Resource Management at the United Nations from 1997 to 2002. She was instrumental in the UN's reform agenda laid out by then Secretary-General Kofi Annan in five core missions: peace and security, economic and social affairs, development cooperation, humanitarian affairs, and human rights.

Tan Sri Dr Rafiah also has excellent service records within the domestic public and private sectors. She has served as a Vice Chancellor/President for the University of Malaya, Dean of the Law Faculty of the University of Malaya, Assistant Governor of the Central Bank of Malaysia, and Human Resources General Manager of Malayan Banking Berhad.

Tan Sri Dr Rafiah was also the Executive Director of the International Centre for Leadership in Finance (ICLIF), as well as the NAM Institute for the Empowerment of Women.

She is currently Chairman of Allianz Malaysia Berhad and Allianz General Insurance Company (Malaysia) Berhad, while serving as a Director of several public-listed companies. Tan Sri Dr Rafiah holds a Master's and a Bachelor's degree in Law from Queen's University Belfast, United Kingdom and was awarded an honorary Doctorate by the same university in 2002. She was called to the Malaysian Bar in 1988.

Dato' Seri Zaini is an academic administrator, environmental engineer and scientist who attempts to blend knowledge, skills, experience and innovation in a harmonious manner.

He served as Secretary-General in the Ministry of Energy, Green Technology and Water for two years. Prior to this, Dato' Seri Zaini was Chairman of the Malaysia Higher Education Blueprint 2015 – 2025 task force during his tenure as Secretary-General for the Ministry of Higher Education.

A prolific writer, Dato' Seri Zaini recently published his 35th book, "Ecoshift: Holistic Transformation towards Environmental Sustainability" (2018) and 36th book on "Japanese Ecosophy: A Traveller's Notes" (2019) which gathers his experience and understanding of science, technology, policy and financing for the environmental sector.

He has over 250 scientific papers in leading academic journals to his name, as well as books on environmental engineering, water sustainability, higher education and learning innovation.

He is also a registered Professional Engineer (Malaysia), Chartered Engineer (UK), Chartered Scientist (UK), and Chartered Water and Environmental Manager (UK). He is a Research Associate at MIT at Imperial College London, Tsukuba and Lund Japan and Research Associate at MIT.

Dato' Seri Zaini was Vice-Chancellor of UTM (2008 – 2013) and he was also the first recipient of the prestigious Merdeka Award for Outstanding Scholastic Achievement in 2009.

Dr Azura graduated with a degree in Accounting and Finance from the London School of Economics and Political Science. She is also a fellow of ACCA (UK), a member of Malaysian Institute of Accountants and a chartered member of the Institute of Chartered Islamic Finance Professionals (CIIF). She received her PhD in Islamic Finance from the International Centre of Education in Islamic Finance (INCEIF).

Currently, Dr Azura is the Chief Executive Officer of the Chartered Institute of Islamic Finance Professionals (CIIF), a professional standardsetting body for Islamic finance practitioners. She is also a Non-Executive Director of Malaysia Debt Ventures Berhad since 2018 where she chairs the Board Audit Committee and an Independent Director of CIMB Islamic Bank Berhad. She served as an Independent Non-Executive Director of Bank Muamalat Malaysia Berhad from 2015 until September 2020, where she chaired the Board Audit Committee and the Nomination and Remuneration Committee.

She was a former Executive Director of PricewaterhouseCoopers Taxation Services, Malaysia with over 19 years of experience as a tax consultant and in engagements relating to Islamic Finance. Among her major assignments include formulating the tax incentives for Malaysia as the Malaysia Islamic Financial Centre (MIFC). She authored a book on Macroeconomic Policy and Islamic Finance as well as various chapters and articles on Islamic finance.

At Pengerang, she subsequently took on the role of Head, Strategic Communications & Stakeholder Management, at PETRONAS Refinery and Petrochemical Corporation Sdn Bhd (PRPC) for over four years before returning to Kuala Lumpur in 2020 as Head, Stakeholder Relations & Communications, President's Office, orchestrating the communications for the new president of PETRONAS.

She was appointed as Head, Group Strategic Communications effective 1 January 2021, where she provides stewardship and orchestrates integrated communications strategy encompassing brand management, media relations, communications management, change management and stakeholder relations for PETRONAS groupwide.

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# Education

At Yayasan PETRONAS, education holds a special place in our hearts. Our mission is simple yet powerful – we want to advance education in Malaysia to drive the progress of our nation.



### **Education** Pillar



Since 2019, we have made a positive impact on the lives of over 90,000 students, teachers and district education officers through exciting education initiatives. Our ultimate goal is to achieve a 60:40 National STEM enrolment throughout the country. We believe that by empowering the underserved through education, we are equipping them with the tools they need to thrive and succeed in life.

**STEM subject** declining by



STEM education is crucial for driving Malaysia's progress. However, the uptake for STEM in the country is quite low. The enrolment into STEM subjects is declining by about 6,000 students every year and is significantly lower than enrolment in non-STEM streams.

### **Program Duta Guru (PDG)**

PDG is our flagship programme which empower teachers to make learning fun and effective to help students excel in their higher order thinking skills (HOTS) through science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) subjects.



### **BOLD (Bridging the Online Learning Divide)** by Sentuhan Ilmu

The BOLD Programme implemented by Yayasan PETRONAS and MYReaders, aims to tackle learning loss among high-needs students resulting from the COVID-19 pandemic. Under BOLD, students from B40 communities will be provided with Internet-enabled devices, digital modules, and a structured learning support programme facilitated by 1,600 volunteer tutors who are recruited and trained to deliver one-to-one remediation remotely using the MYReaders Literacy Toolkit. The programme focuses on building foundational literacy skills through phonics, reading fluency and comprehension. By addressing the educational challenges faced by underprivileged students, BOLD aims to bridge the learning divide and ensure equitable access to education. The programme's goals include improving reading proficiency and fostering interest in STEM subjects.

### **empower Akademik**

empower Akademik is a programme that strives to enhance the academic performance of B40 SPM students and provide better opportunities for their tertiary education. The programme is in collaboration with the Northern Corridor Economic Region (NCER) and Eastern Corridor Economic Region (ECER) to support underperforming B40 SPM students, helping them improve academically and successfully transition to higher education. Students are given more than 100 hours of tutoring and are guided in continuing their education journey after their SPM exams.


### YP STEM School Adoption (YPSSAP

The YPSSAP programme focuses on nurturing the interest and motivation of upper-secondary students in STEM fields, with the goal of encouraging them to pursue STEM-related disciplines in tertiary education. Developed in collaboration with Petrosains, the programme provides students with real-life STEM experiences and fosters STEM skills through informal science learning methods. Students actively participate in a series of STEM career activities designed to provide them with comprehensive insights into various STEM career pathways. By immersing students in these experiences, YPSSAP aims to cultivate a strong foundation and passion for STEM among the participants.

### Coding4All (C4A)



Coding4All is designed to enhance the technical skills of secondary students in underserved communities. The primary objective is to foster their interest in the STEM field, empowering them to further develop their skills to meet the demands of the future workforce. Developed in collaboration with Petrosains, the programme utilises coding and programming to scaffold students' knowledge and abilities, instilling confidence in applying technology through digital adoption. To ensure long-term sustainability, Coding4All includes capacity development for local community members, enabling ongoing skill advancement opportunities for students.


### **Young Technologist Programme (YTP)**

YTP focuses on boosting the confidence of lower secondary students to enrol in STEM package during Form 4 and prepare them for future employment opportunities. The programme achieves this by enhancing their competency in the 21st-century learning skills of the 4C's: Communication, Collaboration, Critical Thinking, and Creativity. In collaboration with Petrosains and Yayasan Terengganu, the programme supports students in mastering these 4C's through engaging activities such as project-based learning and design thinking. Additionally, YTP exposes students to a range of STEM pathways, providing them with valuable insights into potential careers in the field.

### **Edvolution Enterprise (Edvolution)**

Edvolution seeks to support the welfare and recovery of students' learning through the Leadership Training on Recovery Learning Loss in Schools programme. The Perlis Special Teens Centre (PeSTeC) has been renovated with support from Yayasan PETRONAS' grant, allowing improved education and vocational training for special needs teenagers and youths. The upgraded centre now includes better-equipped classrooms, a hall, a sick bay, an office, a food processing workshop, an outdoor gym, a mini therapy garden, a minimart, and agricultural sites. Since May 2022, PeSTeC has been operating in its enhanced facilities with a handover event to celebrate the completion of these modifications.



### **CyberWira**

The CyberWira programme is an "all-in-one" digital citizenship e-learning course for Yayasan PETRONAS' CERDIK recipients, primarily targeting teens aged from 13 to 18. This unique programme focuses on online safety and empowers students to make the most of the potential opportunities in the digital world. The CyberWira for CERDIK Recipients programme is implemented in three phases across various states in Malaysia, aiming to enhance students' digital citizenship skills and promote self-directed learning, while also increasing teachers' awareness.

There are communities that are left helpless as their homes have been lost to floods while others struggle to afford basic necessities, making their daily lives incredibly challenging.

We strive to uplift the livelihoods of the B40 communities in Kelantan, Kedah, Terengganu, Johor, Pahang, Perak and Sabah. We achieved this by leveraging the impactful MEKAR Programme, which has been a beacon of hope and support for those in need. Through MEKAR, we extended aid in three categories:

### Sentuhan Kasih Disaster Relief

This year, under our Sentuhan Kasih Disaster Relief programme, we collaborated with the Department of Social Welfare and **donated 5,000 aid packages** to families across the country that were affected by the flood disasters. The aid packages consisted of daily necessities such as mineral water, towels, blankets and toiletries. Additionally, food was channelled to temporary relief centres (PPS) country-wide **covering 19 districts in 10 states** which are Johor, Kedah, Kelantan, Melaka, Negeri Sembilan, Perak, Pahang, Selangor, Sabah and Terengganu.

Yayasan PETRONAS also worked together with National Disaster Management Association Malaysia (NADIM) to introduce the Community-Based Disaster Risk Management (CBDRM) training initiative to local communities in Tumpat, Kelantan and Pekan, Pahang. Both areas have experienced the devastating impact of floods in the past. As such, we provided training to equip these communities with the necessary skills and capabilities to manage future disasters as well as to foster stronger relationships with our communities.



### Cancer Research Malaysia (CRMY)

Our support for cancer research for the Asian population with CRMY continued this year as **we worked towards increasing the survival chances of patients**. CRMY stands as the sole non-profit organisation within the nation, committed to safeguarding lives through impactful research specifically to benefit Asian communities. To date, we have **contributed RM1,000,000 to the organisation** which is used to drive new research that will address cancer more effectively, from prevention to detection and treatment.



### **Initiative For Precision Medicine in Paediatric Cancer Therapy (IMPACT)**

We have exchanged a Memorandum of Agreement with Universiti Kebangsaan Malaysia (UKM) for the IMPACT initiative to increase the survival rate of paediatric cancer patients in the nation under Hospital Canselor Tuanku Mukhriz (HCTM). In the first phase of IMPACT, we will be providing grants to UKM which will fund HCTM and HPKK-UKM's operational costs and expenses in research advancement and works. A long-term initiative, our grant amounting to RM6.14 million will support efforts to increase the survival rate of paediatric cancer patients at HCTM to be on par with advanced nations by 2028. The initiative will target the B40 group of patients, which comprises 75% of childhood cancer patients at the hospital.

### **MyLady Assistance Scheme**

We extended our support to the MyLady Assistance Scheme, a programme aimed at empowering single mothers and women living with HIV to overcome poverty. Through this initiative, these women were provided with opportunities such as microcredit business loans, entrepreneurial training, and peer support, enabling them to establish and sustain their home-based enterprises.

The MyLady Assistance Scheme successfully assisted a total of 30 single mothers and women living with HIV.

### **SAGA Health Access Programme (SHAPE)**

Implemented by the Malaysia AIDS Foundation (MAF) and supported by Yayasan PETRONAS, SHAPE has made a profound impact on the lives of B40 patients battling HIV, Thalassemia, and Paediatric illnesses in rural Sabah. By subsidising the high logistical expenses involved in reaching local hospitals or clinics, SHAPE has enabled these individuals to attend their crucial treatment appointments. ### **Nazumidin YourGood**

Another inspiring story is of Nazumidin, also known as Naz. After he lost his job in Kelantan, Naz had no income. He noticed that there was a lack of yoghurt drinks sold in Kedah. Fuelled by his love for dairy products, he eagerly learned how to make yoghurt to establish his own business in Kedah. At first, he started delivering door-to-door but as lockdown restrictions eased, he set up a roadside stall to serve his customers directly.

Naz received the Makanan Selamat, Tanggungjawab Industri (MeSTI) certification, which is a certification scheme implemented by the Ministry of Health (MOH) Malaysia for food handlers to abide by the food safety assurance system. The certification is obtained through the empowerNCER programme, supported by Yayasan PETRONAS which ensured that food was prepared in a clean environment, giving customers peace of mind, but Naz did not stop there. He expanded his business further, offering variations of his yoghurt drink and included other items on his menu such as "roti kukus." Naz also enlisted the help of his brothers to meet the growing demands of customers. With an entrepreneurial mindset, he also looked into marketing his homemade dairy products in local supermarkets as well as other ways to grow his business. We are privileged to have played a part in his business venture and we wish him every success.



### Walk4Trees

We launched a tree planting project in September 2020, in support of PETRONAS' Walk4Trees Challenge. The initiative aims to benefit the health of PETRONAS employees and support the company's sustainability goals. The programme has several key objectives, which are to:

The Walk4Trees Project positively impacted communities involved in various ways. Firstly, it has provided the B40 community with additional sustainable livelihood opportunities and generated revenue through activities such as the seedling buy-back system and allowances for nursery maintenance and tree planting. Secondly, the project also supports the empowerment of local communities in rehabilitating forest, mangrove, and peat swamp ecosystems, promoting sustainable resource management. Thirdly, it has enhanced the knowledge and skills of locals and Orang Asli community groups in proper tree planting techniques and monitoring, raising awareness about the importance of the activity for environmental protection and the reduction of soil erosion. Furthermore, Walk4Trees has played an important role in facilitating learning visits and peer-to-peer training, strengthening knowledge and skills in mangrove management for the participating communities.


## Tree Planting Activities in Partnership with Global Environment Centre (GEC)

We have appointed the Global Environment Centre (GEC) as the implementation partner for the Walk4Trees Project, and we also encourage the participation of local communities, with a focus on the B40 group, in the community-based rehabilitation, protection, and development of programmes

Our partnership with GEC reflects our commitment to supporting environmental restoration with the goal to plant 50,000 trees in 14 locations nationwide. The tree planting activities are implemented in two phases.

## **UTP Tree Planting**

We have collaborated with Universiti Teknologi PETRONAS (UTP) to launch a tree planting programme at the university campus under our Sentuhan Alam initiative. We have pledged to have a total of 500 trees from various native species to be planted under this programme and creating more awareness in society to actively participate in climate actions.



### Walk4Trees programme

As part of the Walk4Trees programme, Yayasan PETRONAS visited Kampung Buntal in Sarawak, a fishing village with approximately 5,000 residents. The programme has attracted 14 beneficiaries including Wahab, Man, Saad, and Satim, who are deeply committed to environmental conservation. Despite living in different villages, they have come together to support the initiative and raise awareness about the importance of tree planting. Through their efforts, they aim to restore the balance of the ecosystem, reduce carbon emissions, and inspire other communities to follow suit.

The Walk4Trees programme has not only brought the community of Kampung Buntal closer but also provided them with financial benefits. The residents are involved in the maintenance and monitoring of the planted trees, ensuring their growth and well-being. Additionally, they prioritise keeping the planting areas clean and free from pollution. Yayasan PETRONAS, in collaboration with GEC, remains dedicated to supporting environmental conservation through tree planting activities across the country. Our aim is not only to reduce carbon emissions but also to empower and uplift the lives of 254 B40 communities through their active involvement in tree development, management, and protection.
